

## **Bahá'í Studies Review: AI Use and Disclosure Policy for Authors**

---

The responsible use of generative artificial intelligence (AI) tools is permitted in the preparation of manuscripts submitted to the Bahá'í Studies Review, provided such use is limited, transparent, and appropriately disclosed. Authors may use generative AI to improve the readability and language of their work, for purposes such as grammar correction, paraphrasing, or enhancing clarity. However, any such use should be done under strict human oversight, ensuring that the final manuscript is the result of the authors' own critical thinking and intellectual input.

AI tools must not be used to generate novel content, such as the formulation of hypotheses, analysis or interpretation of data, or drafting of conclusions. These are core elements of scholarly work and must be performed exclusively by the human authors listed on the manuscript. AI tools must not be listed as authors, co-authors, or contributors, as they cannot take responsibility for the content or respond to post-publication queries.

### **Disclosure**

Any use of generative AI tools must be clearly disclosed in the cover sheet. This disclosure must include:

- The name and version of the tool used.
- A brief description of how the tool was used (e.g., for language editing or summarization).
- A statement affirming that the authors reviewed and take full responsibility for the content produced with the aid of the AI.

Use of standard automated tools for spellchecking or reference management does not require disclosure.

### **Images**

The generation or modification of images, figures, graphical abstracts, or visual data using generative AI tools is not permitted. This includes using AI to create new visual content or to alter existing images in a way that could misrepresent or distort original data. Acceptable image adjustments are limited to routine enhancements such as resizing, brightness or contrast corrections, or cropping, and must not affect the integrity of the data presented.

In exceptional cases where AI-generated or AI-processed images form an essential part of the research methodology, their inclusion is permitted but must be accompanied by a detailed description of the AI system used, including the tool's name, version, training data (where relevant), and the parameters applied. Such use must be clearly documented in the Methods section, and underlying source or raw data must be made available upon request.

### **Author Responsibility**

Authors are reminded that generative AI tools may introduce errors, fabricate facts, or replicate biases found in their training data. Authors are fully responsible for verifying the accuracy and originality of any AI-assisted content, and for ensuring that its use complies with ethical standards and copyright requirements. By submitting to the Bahá'í Studies Review, authors confirm that they have complied with this policy and accept full accountability for all aspects of the manuscript.
